Celebrating Colorado's Birthday in Style

In July, Highlands Ranch celebrated America's 250th anniversary with Star-Spangled Birthday Bash activities throughout the Fourth of July weekend. Now, on August 1, the Highlands Ranch Community Association (HRCA) will host an outdoor festival to celebrate another huge birthday for local residents: Colorado's 150th.

Colorado became the nation's 38th state in 1876, exactly 100 years after the birth of the United States. It is for this reason that it earned the nickname "The Centennial State."

"Our community had an amazing time observing Independence Day in July, gathering together despite weather restrictions at events both time-honored and brand new," said HRCA CEO/GM Mike Bailey. "We can't wait to experience a similar atmosphere in August at this special 150th anniversary celebration that recognizes our great state, its history and its citizens."

The Colorado 150 Celebration will kick off with a performance by Latin funk band **Latin Sol**. Additional bands are slated throughout the day, including Denver's Five Points-inspired **JoFoKe & Same Cloth**, Colorado bluegrass favorite **High Lonesome**, and free-spirited jam band **Tumbledown Shack**. Finally, the **Petty Nicks Experience** will close the night with a setlist paying homage to the iconic sounds of Tom Petty and Stevie Nicks.

But music won't be the only activity on the cards for attendees. A variety of food trucks will be on-site delivering local fare, including Colorado favorites like green chile, wild game, BBQ, wood-fired pizza, fresh-baked sourdough, tacos and more. And no celebration of Colorado culture would be complete without craft beverages from some of the state's favorite breweries, including everything from Colorado's oldest brewing traditions and classic craft favorites to local wines, ciders and hometown beers brewed right here in Highlands Ranch.

Finally, the festival will showcase booths from HRCA Community Partner businesses and non-profit organizations featuring tchotchkes and games, as well as local vendors that will be offering Colorado-themed crafts and artwork for sale.

Clear the Clutter Recap

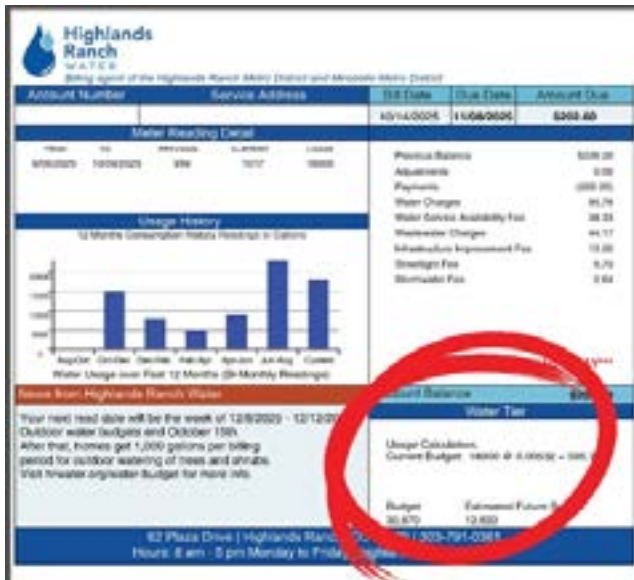

What is a Water Budget?

Highlands Ranch Water uses water budgets to calculate a customer's water bill. Think of your water budget as your household's water allowance for each two-month billing cycle. It tells you how much water you can use before higher water rates apply.



Water budgets help ensure every customer has enough water for everyday needs while encouraging efficient outdoor watering based on the size of each property.

Water budgets provide an indoor and outdoor component.

1. **Indoor component** – Every household has an indoor water budget of 12,000 gallons of water every two-month billing period. This is for everyday indoor needs such as showers, laundry and cooking.
2. **Outdoor component** – During the irrigation season, additional water is added based on the size of your property. Larger properties receive a larger outdoor budget than smaller properties.

Your water budget changes during the irrigation season. Because landscapes need more water during the hottest months, your outdoor water budget increases through the spring and summer before decreasing again in the fall.

How does my water budget impact my water bill?

If you stay within your water budget, you'll pay the standard water rate. If you exceed your budget, the water you use above your budget is billed at a higher rate.

How does this translate to drought pricing?

Drought pricing was enacted as part of Stage 1 drought restrictions. Many customers think drought pricing affects everyone. It doesn't. Drought pricing only applies to water used above your water budget. If you stay within your budget, you'll continue paying the standard water rate even during Stage 1 drought restrictions.

Key takeaway

Don't use more water than what is allocated in your water budget; if you do, you will pay more for the water you use. Scan the QR code to learn more about water budgets.

How do I find out what my water budget is?

To find out what your water budget is, simply look at your water bill. You can find out what your water budget is for the current billing cycle and an estimate of your water budget for the next billing cycle in the section titled **Water Tier** on the right side of your bill.



Bison Return to Historic Prairie Habitat in Highlands Ranch

For the first time in more than 150 years, bison are once again grazing the native prairie of Highlands Ranch—a landmark conservation milestone that reconnects the region with an important piece of Colorado’s natural history.

The Highlands Ranch Community Association Backcountry Wilderness Area partnered with Denver Mountain Parks, Denver Zoo Conservation Alliance, and Sanctuary Golf Course to bring a portion of the historic Daniels Park bison herd to the Backcountry Wilderness Area. The managed grazing initiative allows the herd to seasonally roam a protected native prairie pasture, where they will help restore ecological processes that once shaped Colorado’s grasslands.



Bison are considered a keystone species because their natural grazing patterns promote, diverse plant communities, improve soil health, support wildlife habitat and increase the resilience of native grasslands. The Daniels Park herd also carries remarkable conservation significance, tracing its lineage to one of Colorado’s earliest wildlife restoration efforts and some of the last remaining wild bison in North America.



Spanning more than 7,000 acres, the Backcountry Wilderness Area provides an ideal setting to balance habitat conservation, scientific stewardship, environmental education and carefully managed recreation. In addition to its ecological benefits, the project offers residents and visitors a unique opportunity to learn about the historic relationship between bison, the Great Plains and Indigenous cultures while witnessing one of North America’s most iconic animals in its native landscape.

The return of bison represents far more than the reintroduction of a species—it symbolizes restoration, resilience and the power of regional collaboration to protect Colorado’s natural heritage for generations to come.

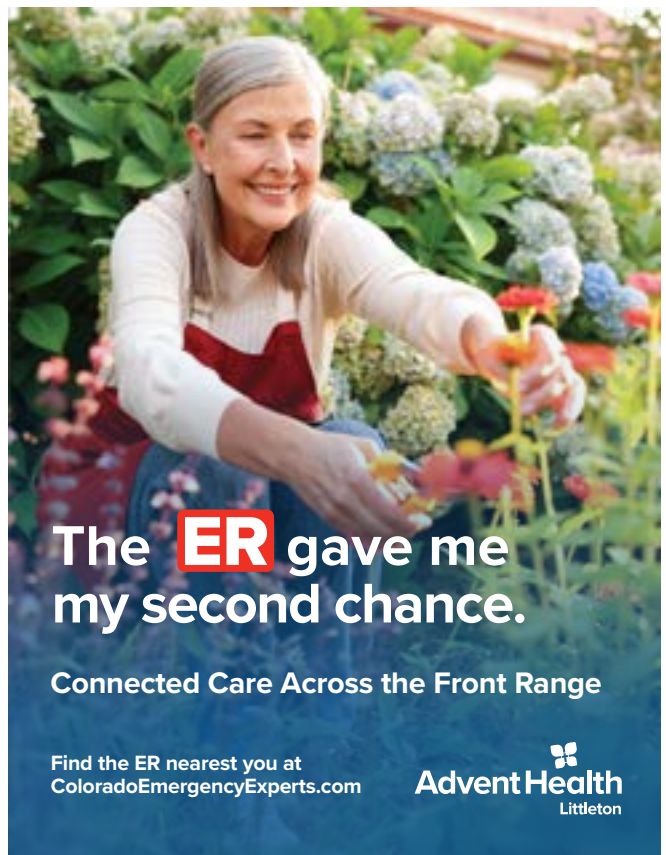

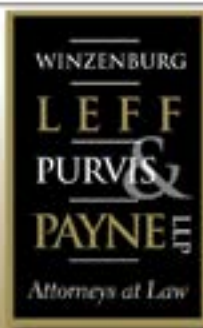
