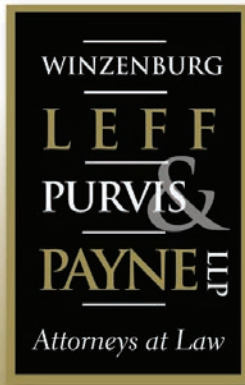

Drought Update

The Highlands Ranch Water service area continues in Stage 1 drought restrictions. Customers should reduce their water use by 15–20% and limit outdoor watering to two days per week. Drought pricing is also in effect to support these conservation efforts. Drought pricing only applies to water used above your water budget. If you stay within your budget, your water rates will not change.

Stage 1 drought restrictions

Residential two-day watering schedules:

Odd-numbered addresses	Wednesday and Saturday
Even-numbered addresses	Thursday and Sunday
Multi-family and apartment properties	Monday and Friday

Learn more about what's behind your water

Highlands Ranch Water's annual Water Quality Report is now available, offering customers an inside look at where their water comes from and how it's treated and protected. You can learn about the steps Highlands Ranch Water takes every day to safeguard public health and maintain compliance with all state and federal drinking water regulations.

Highlands Ranch Water is proud to report that, once again, the district's drinking water met or exceeded all U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) standards.

Make the shift to more efficient irrigation equipment

You can save a significant amount of water simply by switching to more efficient irrigation equipment. High-efficiency sprinkler nozzles, smart controllers, and drip irrigation are three easy upgrades you can make to reduce your water use. And you can get rebates for all of these and more from Highlands Ranch Water!

- **High-efficiency nozzles** – Replace outdated, traditional fixed spray nozzles with efficient rotary ones and receive \$4 per nozzle. Please visit the district's website to view a list of qualifying models for rotary/high-efficiency nozzles.
- **Drip irrigation** – Switch from overhead spray irrigation to drip irrigation and receive \$50 per zone.
- **Smart controller** – Install a WaterSense labeled smart irrigation controller. A rebate of up to \$75 is available. *Any brand is acceptable.*
- **Rachio controller** – Thanks to a partnership with Rachio, customers can purchase a Rachio controller at a discounted price. *Discounts are only available for eight and 16 zone controllers.*
- **Rain sensor** – Add a rain sensor to stop watering when nature takes care of it and receive a rebate of up to \$35.

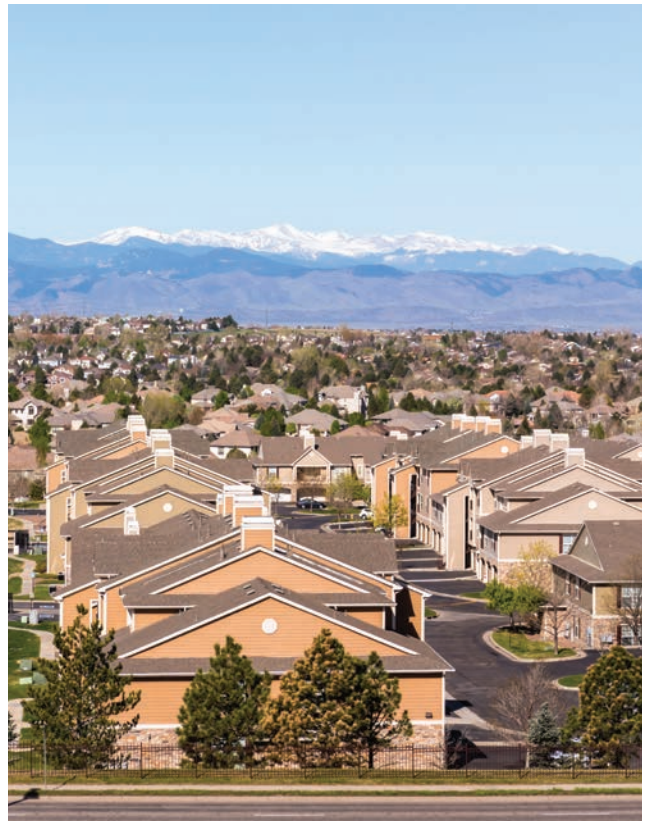


A Little Patience Goes a Long Way

HRCA's Residential Technicians are a visible part of our community. They travel through Highlands Ranch in marked vehicles, observing exterior property conditions, responding to concerns, and helping ensure the Residential Improvement Guidelines and community standards are being followed. Their work is not always easy, and it is not always popular. Covenant compliance can involve difficult conversations, competing perspectives, and occasional frustration. Even so, the purpose of this work is straightforward: to help preserve the appearance, consistency, and long-term value of Highlands Ranch as a place people are proud to call home.

Many of our technicians are Highlands Ranch residents themselves, and all of them are part of the HRCA team working on behalf of this community. They are not outside parties looking for conflict or trying to make life difficult for residents. They are staff members carrying out responsibilities assigned to them for the benefit of the community as a whole.

Many residents greet our technicians with a wave, a smile, or a simple acknowledgment.



Those small gestures matter. Unfortunately, our technicians also occasionally experience unkind gestures, shouted comments, or impatience while they are simply doing their jobs and driving cautiously through neighborhood streets.

We understand that not everyone will agree with every covenant concern, observation, or enforcement process. Residents have the right to ask questions, seek clarification, and use the processes available to them. But disagreement does not require disrespect. A basic level of courtesy helps everyone. It allows staff to do their work professionally, helps residents receive better information, and supports the shared standards that make Highlands Ranch an attractive and well-maintained community.

The next time you see one of our marked vehicles in your neighborhood, a wave or a little patience goes a long way. Civility is not complicated. It starts with how we treat the people working to serve the community we all share.

Bison Return to Historic Prairie Habitat in Highlands Ranch

For the first time in a century and a half, bison once again roam the native prairie of Highlands Ranch, restoring a connection to Colorado's natural past and opening a new chapter in local conservation.

In late June, conservation leaders, media and invited guests gathered in the Highlands Ranch Community Association's Backcountry Wilderness Area to celebrate the historic return of a portion of the Daniels Park bison herd. The ceremonial release marked the beginning of a managed grazing partnership between the Backcountry Wilderness Area, Denver Mountain Parks, and Denver Zoo Conservation Alliance.

As the bison stepped into their new pasture, they returned to a landscape their ancestors once shaped through centuries of grazing. The initiative allows the herd to seasonally graze approximately 200 acres of native prairie, helping restore ecological processes that have been absent from the area for generations.

Bison are widely recognized as a keystone species whose natural behaviors benefit entire ecosystems. Their grazing patterns encourage diverse native plant communities, improve soil health, create habitat for birds and other wildlife, and increase the resilience of grassland ecosystems. Conservationists view their return as an important step toward restoring the health and function of Colorado's historic prairie landscapes.

For Highlands Ranch, the project represents a unique opportunity to blend conservation, education, and community engagement. Visitors to the Backcountry Wilderness Area will have the chance to learn about the vital role bison played in shaping the American West



and their enduring connection to Indigenous cultures and prairie ecosystems.

"The Backcountry Wilderness Area is uniquely suited for a project like this," said HRCA CEO and General Manager Mike Bailey. "As a 7,000-acre conservation landscape, it allows us to balance habitat protection, education, and carefully managed recreation while preserving a place where wildlife can thrive. Hosting these bison is a natural extension of that mission."

The Daniels Park herd, managed by Denver Mountain Parks, is among Colorado's most historically significant conservation herds. Descended from some of the last wild bison in North America, the animals help preserve valuable genetic diversity while supporting broader conservation efforts.

Their return to Highlands Ranch serves as a powerful symbol of restoration, resilience, and partnership—demonstrating how collaborative stewardship can reconnect communities with the landscapes and wildlife that once defined the American prairie.
